Subject: Reducing cut-off mark (AICET-21 Merit) for SPOT ADMISSION under CITS - 2021-22 at NSTIs and IToTs – reg.

1. The schedule for Spot admission based on AICET-Merit List subject to availability of seats at NSTIs and IToTs are as follows:

2. In order to fill the remaining vacant seats and use the training infrastructure optimally, for spot admissions, minimum AICET cut off marks are reduced as given below:

	General	OBC-NCL/GEN-EWS	SC/ST/PH
Lower cut-off out of 100 marks	20	15	10

3. In the CITS 2021 counselling/admission process and instructions to candidates at serial no.17 for spot admission instruction are given to only NSTIs but IToTs are not mentioned by NIMI. Hence **IToTs** should also be added as given below:

- All eligible candidate list who have not taken admission so far will be available in all **NSTI/IToT** login.
- Candidates who have not paid their counselling Fee earlier should pay their Counselling Fees online
- Candidate can select the **NSTI/IToT** of his/her choice as per vacancy available
- Approach the nearest NSTI/IToT for document verification
- Seats will be allotted as per merit.

3. To monitor SPOT ADMISSION at IToTs (Govt. & Pvt. Both), DGT has constituted Committees who will also observe the presence of admitted trainees and submit a report accordingly (copy of Office Memorandum attached).
